Learners from all over the world work together in teams of 8-12 to operate their own simulation companies in real-time with the help of synchronous communication tools. Students in my class found the collaboration, the virtual environment, and the international context stimulating, and it is the perfect tool to introduce to more colleges and universities.

### 2) Teaching Implications:

VIBu emphasizes learning as a willful, intentional, active, conscious, constructive practice that includes intention-action-reflection activities. During VIBu, the learners discuss the nature of the environment, negotiate together, change knowledge, learn from each other, and make decisions. Thus, they develop an identity as virtual managers of the company they are running.<sup>1</sup>
