# A Proposal for IOBTC 2016 University of Winchester July 8<sup>th</sup> – 9<sup>th</sup>, 2016

## 1) Title of Proposal:

Leadership as if the Planet Mattered: What Skills Will Help Future Leaders Address Climate Change?

2) Abstract

Educating leaders who understand climate change and its organizational and societal impacts is a topic that certainly belongs in the management curriculum, yet integrating it with traditional leadership topics can be challenging. In this session, participants will evaluate a classroom- tested set of five leadership skills for planetary sustainability: is this set pertinent? complete? How does it compare with what is taught traditionally? Second, we will consider how to integrate such skills into management courses and the curriculum. Do they belong in leadership? OB? Strategy? What are the intellectual and political challenges of introducing them at your university?

 What are five key skills that leaders need when working with climate change? This skill set is based on an integration of my several years of experience teaching graduate and undergraduate courses on leadership and sustainability in a large, urban, business school.

From a political standpoint internally to any given institution, the session will promote discussion of the challenges of stand-alone electives (easily cut, not so easily filled) versus integration into mainstream management topics (hard to change).

1. Introduction: my goals for the session 3 minutes

I am planning a book entitled "Leadership as if the planet mattered" that will be based on the theory presented in this session. I hope to develop theory that best meets the needs of the participants, and I seek their feedback to that end.

- 2. Individual participants write down what they imagine leadership skills for sustainability are (whether or not they teach them). *4 minutes*
- 3. I introduce the idea that psychological skills differ from other types of skills (such as strategic thinking0...and ask them to reconsider their list based on this distinction...3 minutes
- 4. I introduce the set of five leadership skills with slides. 15 minutes
- 5. Participants in groups critique the skill set for content *20 minutes* Is the content pertinent? Is it complete? Is it teachable? Is it the best we can do to promote leadership as if the planet mattered?

6. All participants discuss 15 minutes:

Where do these skills fit into a traditional management curriculum? Is a critical management theory perspective important for introducing these? How can I integrate these skills into the curriculum at my home institution?
